

Take Control of Energy Consumption at the Workstation

Conserve energy with a single touch

- The areas of the office that come to mind when businesses think of reducing energy consumption are their data centers.
- Yet, energy consumed at workstations throughout the office accounts for just as much as is consumed at the data center.
- Standby power is the energy wasted when office electronics continue to consume electricity, even after they're powered off.
- Today, it's difficult for companies to control this wasted energy.
- The Belkin Conserve Surge with Timer is a cost- and energy-saving solution for businesses that want to save money and reduce their carbon footprint.
- It helps eliminate wasted standby power right at the workstation—where nearly half of all IT energy costs originate.
- Its automatic timer makes saving money and energy simple while empowering employees to make an impact.



Features:

- Desktop timer button – power on devices with the touch of a button. Either press it again to power devices off at the end of the day or let the timer turn them off for you.
- LED warning light – blinks to alert users of impending shutdown
- 2 always-on outlets for devices requiring constant power (like PCs)
- 6 switched outlets for all other office electronics such as printers, lamps, and phone chargers
- Surge protection – prevents damage to computers and other office electronics

Setup Instructions:

Step 1: Locate the desktop button on the desk. Route the button cable to the surge protector. The user guide can be left attached to the button for removal by the user.

Step 2: Plug the desktop button cable into the jack next to the power cable on the surge protector.


Step 3: Connect the surge power connection to a grounded outlet. If the “Not Grounded” indicator is illuminated, your outlet might not be properly grounded.

Step 4: Plug in equipment that needs constant power into one of the two “Always On” outlets. Suggested use: computers, clocks, and phones.

Step 5: Plug in equipment not requiring constant power into one of the six “Auto Off” outlets. Suggested use: printers, lamps, monitors, and chargers.

Caution:

- Do not plug into an uninterruptible power supply (UPS) or plug a UPS into the Conserve Surge.
- If the red “Not Grounded” light illuminates, this means that your building’s electricity lacks a proper ground, and you should consult an electrician.



Using the Belkin Conserve Surge with Timer

In the morning after arriving at work, the user simply presses the Belkin Conserve Surge with Timer’s desktop button once. This powers on the switched outlets, and the electronics plugged into them turn on. This also initiates a timer in the desktop button that starts a factory-set, 11-hour countdown.

If the user leaves for the day before the 11-hour time expires, the desktop button can be pressed once to power down the outlets. If the user doesn’t press the button, the outlets will be powered off after the timer expires.

If a user is working late, an LED on the desktop button will begin to blink at the end of the 11-hour period. This notifies the user of the impending shutdown. To continue working, the user simply presses the button to reset the timer. If the user doesn’t press the button, the outlets will be powered down so that energy conservation can begin.
